Process:

- BOD will convene meeting with a minimum of two Fining Committee Members and present violation including, but not limited to, violator's name, violator's status (i.e. resident or guest), nature of the violation (i.e. blue book and/or Statute 218 verbiage), any and all pictures, videos, and correspondence (including attorney documents, if applicable)
 - BOD will recommend proposed fine amount at next violation occurrence
- Fining Committee will determine either: a) BOD-proposed fine should be invoiced at next violation occurrence; or b) BOD-proposed fine should be reduced to TBD and subsequently invoiced at next violation occurrence
- Fining Committee can alternately determine that violator should be entitled to a hearing before the Fining Committee
 - BOD Secretary, together with the Fining Committee, will determine an acceptable date/time for the hearing allowing at least 14 days' notice to the violator
 - BOD Secretary will advise the violator of the hearing date/time (via Certified/Return Receipt Requested USPS), will include the violation details and all information contained in the first bullet point above
 - Violator will appear before the Fining Committee on the date/time specified in the violation notice to state his/her case (BOD members are permitted to attend but prohibited from participating; residents are not informed nor invited)
 - Violator will be entitled to present any documentation, explanation, etc. disproving the violation
 - Fining Committee will determine whether: a) violator's presentation excuses him/her from fine at next violation occurrence; or b) violator's presentation does not excuse him/her from fine at next violation occurrence
 - If violator does not appear and/or participate in the hearing, the BOD-recommended fine amount is automatically applicable at next violation occurrence
