



**The First Florida Disaster Preparedness Tax Holiday Runs from 6/1 through 6/14  
The Second Runs from 8/24 through 9/6**

Tax exempt items include:

- Flashlights and lanterns: \$40 or less
- Reusable ice: \$20 or less
- Radios: \$50 or less
- Smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, and carbon monoxide detectors: \$70 or less
- Non-electric food storage coolers: \$60 or less
- Toilet paper, hand soap, dish soap, and laundry detergent: \$30 or less
- Leashes and collars: \$20 or less
- Pet beds: \$40 or less
